

**RESOLUTION NO. 12,365**

**WHEREAS,** The Tribal Hunting and Trapping Code Chapter 350 requires the Tribal Council to review the status of wildlife populations annually and set seasons and bag limits; and,

**WHEREAS,** The Tribal Council has reviewed the attached limits, seasons and other regulations as recommended by the Branch of Natural Resources and the Fish and Wildlife Committee; and,

**WHEREAS,** Through the Treaty with the Tribes of Middle Oregon, signed June 25, 1855, the Confederated Tribes reserved the right to fish, hunt and gather roots and berries outside the reservation boundaries; now, therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED,** By the (27th) Tribal Council of the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon pursuant to article V, section 1 (i) and (l) of the Tribal Constitution & By-laws and the Hunting and Trapping Code Chapter 350.210, that the "2017 CTWS Ceded Lands Hunting Regulations" are adopted as provided in the attached (Exhibit "1") recommendation from the Natural Resources Branch and the Fish and Wildlife Committee.

**CERTIFICATION**

The undersigned, as Secretary-Treasurer/CEO of the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon hereby, certifies that the Tribal Council is composed of 11 members, of whom 10 constituting a quorum were a present at a meeting thereof, duly and regularly called, noticed, convened and held this 22nd day of August, 2017; and the foregoing resolution was passed by the affirmative vote of 9 members, the Chairman not voting; and that the said resolution has not been rescinded or amended in any way.

## 2017 Off-Reservation Ceded Lands SUBSISTENCE Hunting Regulations



### HUNT AREA

The Warm Springs Tribes has established a larger hunt area in 2016 that includes all ceded lands, in addition some lands beyond the ceded lands. Hunters should obtain a new 2017 hunt area map for off-reservation hunts. Please note that **private lands within the hunt area map are NOT open to tribal hunting outside of state seasons or without state issued tags.**

### Regulations and Guidelines

#### TAG(S) AND IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

A Tribal ID and a valid tag for the animal which you are pursuing **MUST** be in possession on your person **at all times** while hunting. Sharing or lending of tags or Tribal ID's is prohibited.

The owner of a tag that kills an animal for which a tag is issued, shall immediately validate the tag by removing in its entirety only the month and day of kill and attach the tag in plain sight securely to the animal. The tag shall be kept attached to such carcass or remain with any parts thereof so long as the same are preserved.

#### Required Reporting

##### Species Hunting Tag Reporting

Requirements: Special species hunters, whether successful, unsuccessful, or did not hunt, must complete and return harvest/hunting reports (the bottom portion of the tag) to the BNR Wildlife Department within 15 days after season closure.

##### General Hunting Tag Reporting

Requirements: The bottom portions of all tags issued for the season must be filled out and returned to the BNR Wildlife Department by Feb. 15, 2018 unless specified otherwise, regardless of whether the hunter was successful, unsuccessful, or did not hunt. Information from these harvest/hunting reports assists in game population monitoring and management.

#### RIFLE RESTRICTIONS:

For Hunting Big Game Species: Rifle caliber is restricted to a minimum of **.22 caliber centerfire or larger** for deer, antelope, bear and cougar all other big game species **.24 caliber or larger - center fire cartridges only.** Rim fire rifles are prohibited for big game hunting. Shotguns must be 10 or 12 gauge using slugs. Archery equipment may be used for harvest during any open rifle seasons for the species that are legal to hunt during that time. During any open rifle season in which a hunter is legal to hunt a species either by regulation or valid tag, a hunter may choose to use a bow or muzzleloader to harvest the legal animal. If a hunter does not have the right to legally possess a firearm due to any law or rule, the hunter may also use archery equipment during a rifle season if all the legal archery equipment regulations are followed.

It is unlawful to possess a firearm or bow while operating a snowmobile or an all-terrain vehicle unless the firearm is unloaded, or with a bow, unless all arrows are in a quiver. For purposes of this regulation, "Unloaded" means:

- If the firearm is a revolver, that there is no live cartridge in the chamber that is aligned with the hammer or revolver;
- If the firearm is a muzzle-loading firearm, that the firearm is not capped or primed;
- If the firearm is other than a revolver or a muzzle-loading firearm, that there is no live cartridge in the chamber.
- Individuals legally licensed to carry concealed firearms are exempt.

#### TRAVEL MANAGEMENT AREAS (TMA)

##### ROAD CLOSURES:

Some portions of the off-reservation roads may be closed for purposes of resource protection, or to provide the safe and secure areas required to ensure healthy big game populations. It is unlawful to operate a motorized vehicle on any road or trail where motorized vehicle use is prohibited. Road closure may be by sign (green/red dot system), gate or other physical barrier. For additional information contact CTWS BNR staff for Motor Vehicle Use Maps (MVUM) for specific areas with road closure schedules.

All Tribal and State road and area closures must be obeyed for wildlife impact purposes.

#### YOUTH HUNTERS:

**HUNTER ORANGE:** Hunters age 17 and under must wear a hunter orange exterior garment (shirt, jacket, coat, vest, or sweater) or hat when hunting game mammals or upland birds (except turkey) with any firearm. The exterior garment or hat must have hunter orange visible in all directions (360 degrees). Hunter education is required for any hunter under age 18 in Oregon this includes Tribal youth hunting off-reservation.

#### Hunter Education

It's recommended for adults new to hunting, too, or as a refresher for veteran hunters. The class gives a thorough introduction to the skills hunters need, covering topics like firearms safety, hunter ethics, wildlife identification, hunt preparation and techniques and outdoor survival. The class takes 14-16 hours and requires a \$10 application fee. All youth students are required to participate in a live fire exercise (students who take the workbook or online option do this by participating in a field day).

#### Tribal Mentored Youth Hunter Program

A youth hunter mentor program will be established through the BNR and conservation enforcement departments

A youth may participate in the tribal mentored youth hunter program, this program allows youth age 9 to 13 to hunt using an adult's tag (and under close adult supervision) without first completing a hunter education course.

Any violation of State wildlife laws which are not specifically authorized by Tribal Council are also subject to Tribal Prosecution under Warm Springs Tribal Code 350.500 and 350.510 (2).



# 2017 Off-Reservation Ceded Lands SUBSISTENCE Hunting Regulations



## TRIBAL CODE

**350.500 Hunting Off-Reservation:** By the Treaty of June 25, 1855, Tribes reserved the right to hunt on open and unclaimed lands within the ceded area off the reservation. It shall be unlawful for any member to hunt off the reservation in violation of this Code.

## 350.510 Off-Reservation Hunting by Members.

1. No member of the Tribes shall exercise treaty hunting rights off-reservation unless he has in his possession an identification card issued by the Tribal Registrar showing him to be a duly enrolled member of the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon. Such card shall be carried on the person of the member at all times and upon demand shall be shown to any federal, state or tribal officer. Any lending or unauthorized alteration or use of identification cards is prohibited.
2. Hunting shall be permitted during open seasons established by the Tribal Council or established in accordance with laws and regulations of the State of Oregon applicable to treaty Indians, as may be modified by the action of the Tribal Council.
3. Bag limit shall be as established by the Tribal Council or established in accordance with the laws and regulations of the State of Oregon applicable to treaty Indians, as may

be modified by the action of the Tribal Council.

4. All persons hunting species for which a "tag" is required by Oregon State law shall have in their possession a "tag" issued by the State of Oregon or a "tag" issued by the Natural Resources Department.

## 350.520 Off-Reservation Ceremonial Hunting.1

5. Off-reservation ceremonial hunting shall take place only during tribally authorized ceremonial hunts and shall be subject to such regulations as are adopted by the Fish and Wildlife Committee or the Tribal Council.
6. Tribal members hunting off reservation for ceremonial purposes must have in their possession at all times both a valid tribal identification card showing the hunter to be an enrolled tribal member and a specially designated tribal ceremonial hunting tag for the species of game for which the ceremonial hunt is conducted issued by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife or the Warm Springs Natural Resources Department.
7. Tribal members participating in tribally authorized off-reservation ceremonial hunts shall abide by all laws and regulations established by the State of Oregon, as may be modified by the Tribal Council, with respect to geographical area of the hunt, the sex and age of the animals that may be taken, the number of animals that may be taken, and other

regulations applicable to each particular tribally authorized ceremonial hunt.

8. No tribal member shall engage in off-reservation hunting for ceremonial purposes unless authorized by the Fish and Wildlife Committee or the Tribal Council.
9. It shall be unlawful for any tribal member participating in a tribally authorized ceremonial hunt to sell, barter, give away or keep game, or any part thereof, taken during a duly authorized off-reservation ceremonial hunt.
10. Unlawful activity in connection with off-reservation ceremonial hunting shall be punishable in accordance with the penalties set out in WSTC 350.700(1).
11. The Natural Resources Department shall report the results of tribally authorized off-reservation ceremonial hunts to the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.
12. Nothing in this section WSTC 350.520 shall be construed as limiting, modifying or altering the treaty-reserved off-reservation hunting rights of the Tribe or its members.

## 350.600 Prior Ordinances

**Repealed.** Ordinance No. 50 adopted October 19, 1971 and all other prior ordinances governing hunting on the reservation and off the reservation by tribal members are hereby repealed.

Gray wolves are currently protected statewide through the Oregon Wolf Conservation and Management Plan. West of Oregon Highways 395/78/95, they are also federally listed as endangered under the federal Endangered Species Act. It is unlawful to kill any wolf in Oregon, except for livestock producer in certain situations.

**The deer hunts will take place on Warm Springs ceded lands and other lands identified on the 2017 Hunt Area (see map). Tribal members must carry their Tribal ID, valid hunting tags and present to law enforcement officials when requested while hunting off-reservation.**

**Legal Weapons:** Centerfire Rifle (.22 caliber or larger), Muzzleloader (.40 caliber or larger open or peep sights and open ignition Archery (40 lb. or greater recurve, long, or compound bow).

**Legal Weapons:** Centerfire Rifle (.24 caliber or larger), Muzzleloader (.50 caliber or larger open or peep sights and open ignition) and Archery (50 lb. or greater recurve, long, or compound bow).

**Legal Weapons:** Pronghorn, Bear, and Cougar- Centerfire Rifle (.22 caliber or larger), Muzzleloader (.40 caliber or larger open or peep sights and open ignition) and Archery (40 lb. or greater recurve, long, or compound bow). **Bighorn Sheep:** Centerfire Rifle (.24 caliber or larger), Muzzleloader (.50 caliber or larger open or peep sights and open ignition) and Archery (50 lb. or greater recurve, long, or compound bow).

# 2017 CTWS Pine Creek Conservation Area

## HUNTING ON THE CONSERVATION AREA

A valid CTWS Tribal identification card, appropriate tags, and Pine Creek hunting permit is required for all hunters on the property. All hunters are subject to the conservation area regulations, and all hunting will be in accordance with tribal, state and federal laws and regulations. Hunting of any species not specifically designated in these regulations or within issued permits is prohibited.

## DEER AND ELK HUNTING SPECIAL ACCESS

Deer and Elk Hunting: Application procedures and permit issuance permits are allocated by computerized lottery. Applications must be received by postal service mail, call in sign-up or sign-up sheet at CTWS BNR office by August 31, 2017 - no exceptions to this deadline are granted. Any permits remaining after the drawing will be made available on a first-come, first-served basis prior to the applicable hunt season opening date. All applications must include the hunter's name, Tribal ID enrollment number, current mailing address and phone number. Interested hunters should apply to:

Successful applicants will receive their permit by postal service mail or picked up at CTWS Branch of Natural Resources office. Hunters must display their permit, license, and tag on demand to anyone on the property.

- A total of **eighty-two (82)** Special tags will be drawn at random using the computerized draw system for eleven (11) separate hunts.
- All access is limited to **walk-in or up to two horses or other pack animals only** for the purpose of hunting. Motorized vehicle access by all persons will be closed.
- Successful applicants must comply with all rules and restrictions identified in the PCCA regulations and additional restriction that may apply.
- All Tag holders (successful, unsuccessful, or did not hunt) must return completed hunting reports (bottom portion of tag/permit) to the CTWS BNR Dept. within 15 days after season closure

## 2017 CTWS Pine Creek Conservation Area Hunt Seasons

**Tag/Permit Limit:** One (1) access permit available per hunt, for lottery drawing through Branch of Natural Resources office. One (1) buck or one (1) elk tag in possession per hunter. The tag must be validated and affixed to deer or elk upon harvest.

**Legal Weapons: Deer:** Centerfire Rifle (**.22 caliber or larger**), Muzzleloader (.40 caliber or larger open or peep sights and open ignition), Archery (40 lb. or larger recurve, long or compound bow), and Shotgun (#1 buck or larger and slugs only).
